

Michigan Child Support Formula - 1/1/2021

Derivative Benefits issues in the Supplement

3.05(E) – Benefits paid on both parent’s earnings record.

Example:

<u>SSD</u>	<u>Derivative Amount</u>
<u>Parent A</u> - \$1,930	\$1,110 (m/c on case)
<u>Parent B</u> - \$1,986	\$1,136 / 2 = \$568

(2 m/c – 1 child on case & one add’l child, w/proof of amt for ea. m/c)

Run MCSF w/Parent B – 90 overnights = B will be payer, so attribute their benefit first 3.05(E)(1).

Anything that exceeds that is income to the other parent.

Because the amount of benefit income attributed to B is \$568, only \$542 will be attributed to A - difference bet. \$1,110 & \$568 - not full \$1,110.

Parent A income = \$2,472	(\$1,930 + \$542)
Parent B income = \$2,554	(\$1,986 + \$568) this m/c’s portion

New c/s \$638 - \$568 (derivate from B) = means B pays \$70 pm.
If new amount is less than \$568 - \$-0- is paid by B.
